QD, qd, Q.D. or qd, QD and Q.O.D. or QOD	Write QAM, "daily", and "every other day".	Missing leading zero: (Example: .5mg)	Include the preceding zero before a decimal point when the dose is less than a whole unit.
Trailing or terminal zero after decimal point (Example: 3.0)	Do NOT use trailing or terminal zeros; write doses as whole numbers.	U or u	Write out the word "units".
		MS, MSO4, MgSO4	Write "morphine sulfate" or "magnesium sulfate".
