Who is Centura Health?

Centura Health is the region's largest health care system. Parker Adventist Hospital:

At Parker Adventist Hospital, we are committed to excellence in health care. We are ranked among the top hospitals in the nation for patient satisfaction and we are a designated Magnet® Hospital from the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC). Our expert doctors and experienced medical teams provide the best health care and excel in more than 55 medical specialties, including nationally-accredited joint and spine programs, Birthplace and NICU, Cancer Center, Center for Bariatric Surgery and Level II Trauma Center Emergency Department. After opening in 2004, Parker Adventist Hospital quickly flourished from a 56-bed community hospital to a 170-bed medical center. Parker is home to more than 1,100 highly-engaged, caregivers who love their work, their teams and live what it means to provide whole person care – body, mind and spirit.

Cardiac Cath Lab Department:

The Cardiac Cath Lab at Parker Adventist Hospital is a seven bed pre/post/recovery area where we perform emergent and scheduled cardiac cases. Here, both diagnostic and interventional Cath Lab procedures are performed. We support the Emergency Department, ICU and Cardiac/Stroke departments. Our mission is to provide exceptional cardiac care, both interventional and diagnostic. There are two roles in the Cardiac Cath Lab – RCIS (Registered Cardiovascular Invasive Specialist) and Cath Lab RN. Both roles work with the cardiologist during procedures. Each must have an extensive knowledge and understanding of cardiology. Both roles require an on-call commitment, excellent clinical skills, critical thinking skills and the ability to function in a high-stress, complex work environment.

Cardiac Stroke Department:

The Cardiac Stroke department at Parker Adventist Hospital has 14 rooms. Here, we treat patients who have had strokes, patients 24 hours after stroke interventions, cardiac



patients, heart failure, post-procedural heart cath patients and those experiencing chest pain. We occasionally receive overflow with patients who are here for other medical reasons and have a strong cardiac history.

We are on a mission to provide high quality service and care to our community. Our team has a great culture, strong teamwork and are a bridge to ICU as we are all on one unit. Since we are a sister unit to the ICU, individuals working on this unit also have exposure to ICU patients. We look for individuals with strong teamwork abilities and encourage a collaborative effort. We also seek candidates who are not afraid to ask questions, want to grow their nursing practice in telemetry, have critical thinking skills, like to learn new procedures/technologies and enjoy working in a fast-paced team environment. Candidates must also be able to use downtime wisely to grow their own knowledge and skill but be able to handle unexpected schedule changes as cases are added.

Emergency Department:

The Emergency Department at Parker Adventist Hospital has 27 treatment spaces, four of which are low acuity treatment spaces, four are psych safe rooms and three are high acuity/trauma rooms. We see about 80-90 patients a day at our Level II trauma center. Our patients are a mix of ED/trauma cases, psych patients and low acuity. RNs will orient to all areas of the ED but will need to be in the department for a year to work in triage. Nurses are assigned to zones and work together as a team. Our department has a positive culture and we have a Unit Based Counsel that gives feedback to make immediate changes. We look for candidates that are team-oriented and compassionate.

Intensive Care Unit (ICU):

The ICU department at Parker Adventist Hospital is a Specialty Level II Trauma unit and a Cardiac and Stroke Program Center of Excellence with 16 beds. We have a mixed acuity and service medical surgical ICU. The patient mix is mostly medical which covers anything from acute renal failure, sepsis, neuro surgical, trauma, stroke and heart attack patients.

Our mission is to provide high quality service and care to our community. This department has a great culture of team work, with room to grow within the department, both personal and professional. After one year, associates can advance their professional certifications with the experience they have gained in our department. We offer growth opportunities that include careers as charge nurses, clinical coordinators, and assistant nurse managers. We look for candidates that are adaptable, team oriented and are self-driven.

Medical Oncology:

The Medical Oncology department at Parker Adventist Hospital serves oncology and medical patients in our 32 beds. Our patient mix is cancer patients (usually leukemia,



lymphoma, brand new diagnosis, etc.), most cancer patients start here with induction chemotherapy. We see all types of cancers including some lung and breast cancers where not all receive chemo and neutropenia. Some patients may stay in our department for an extended length of time and we are able to develop strong relationships with them. Our department is teamwork focused with a lot of comradery; we gather as families outside of work and are a big family at work. We operate with a small-town feel and individuals can build their foundation here where they will be supported in pursuing other career opportunities. This is a great unit to build your foundation in nursing, a wonderful place to see and learn it all. This department is excellent for newly licensed nurses as a starting point in their career journey. We are looking for engaged, innovative and creative individuals who want to learn and grow. Individuals excel here when they are open to consistent learning, growing with feedback, zero drama, reliable and can work within a team.

Medical Surgical 2W:

The Medical Surgical 2W unit at Parker Adventist Hospital is a 35-bed medical surgical, bariatric surgery unit that also treats trauma patients. We receive occasional overflow during the winter to treat patients who have the flu. Our mission is to give each patient the utmost care, while working as a team. We offer self-scheduling with the obligation to work every-other weekend, even though you may not actually have to work that weekend, availability is required. This unit fosters great teamwork and promoting associates is encouraged. Individuals here must be strong team players and eager to learn, newly licensed nurses are welcome. We will help you achieve what you are looking for in a career!

Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU):

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Parker Adventist Hospital is a 12-bed unit. We care for infants born at 28 weeks and above. Most our census is lower acuity, feeder and grower babies. We value close teamwork and collaborative relationships with the OB department and we also attend well baby deliveries. Candidates must be flexible and have a positive attitude.

Neuro/Joint/Spine:

The Neuro/Joint/Spine department at Parker Adventist Hospital is a 24-bed unit specializing in elective neuro, orthopedic, spine surgeries and trauma patients. Our neuro population ranges from tumor removals, subdural and subarachnoid hemorrhages, traumatic brain injuries and elective spine surgeries ranging from microdiscectomies to spinal fusions. The elective orthopedic population largely consists of total joint replacements; however, we also specialize in trauma. Our trauma patient population



primarily consists of bone and brain trauma. We focus on the Centura Health CRISSIE values and incorporate them into the culture of our unit. We have fantastic teamwork in our department which helps support our high surgical volumes. We are a fast-paced unit that encourages growth and learning in an everyday routine. We support the growth of our associates through continuing education and fail-safe RN certifications. We have many resources on our unit including an orthopedic program manager, spine program manager, and an orthopedic/trauma Nurse Practitioner. When interviewing candidates, we look for someone who puts the safety of patients first. We seek out candidates with good critical thinking skills that have a positive attitude and a team first mentality.

OB Post Partum:

The OB Post-Partum department at Parker Adventist Hospital handles Labor and Delivery, mom/baby and GYN patients in our 22-bed unit where we have about 100 deliveries each month. Our patient mix is mom/baby couplets and GYN surgical. Our mission is to provide excellent and compassionate care to families during a special time in their lives. We offer a collaborative culture, opportunity to cross train to different areas (lactation, Level II NICU and scrub for c-Section). We seek team players who are flexible, collaborative and adaptable to change.

Orthopedic Spine:

The Orthopedic Spine department at Parker Adventist Hospital is an outpatient orthopedic clinic. All ages of patients with orthopedic injuries are seen in our very busy orthopedic clinic. We offer a great opportunity to learn and cross cover with various orthopedic sub-specialties. Individuals who have experience, take initiative, can multi task and work in a very busy environment are welcome on our team!

Surgery:

The Surgery department at Parker Adventist Hospital has 14 operating rooms, and we perform approximately 8,200 surgeries per year. We specialize in cancer care, robotic surgery, complex spine, brain surgery, weight-loss surgery as well as joint-replacement. We are a Nationally Certified Bariatric Surgery Program by the Joint Commission, Level II Trauma Center with one staffed operating room - a designated trauma room. We are also a Joint Commission Certified Spine Program, and a Joint Commission Certified Joint Replacement Program. Our mission involves education and professional development at all levels. We have a perioperative residency program for nurses interested in transitioning to the operating room as well as surgical tech students. Teaching is part of every associate's responsibility. Patient safety is always the focus of every educational opportunity and all perioperative team members are true patient safety advocates. This is a desirable



department as we offer a variety of shift opportunities including eight, ten, or 12-hour shifts. We have a day shift, evening shift, and night shift. Being on call is a requirement that is compensated, and the response time is 30 minutes.

Southlands Emergency Room:

The Southlands Emergency Room unit at Parker Adventist Hospital is a freestanding ED, where we care for all emergency and medical conditions. We have nine beds and six vertical spaces, and we see around 21-25 patients per day. Our mission is to provide professional, patient-centered care by utilizing clinical excellence, innovation and compassion in all that we do. We have an intimate and collaborative culture that is always based on what is best for the patient, which has led to high associate and patient satisfaction scores. Team members must be engaged in their work, value excellence in clinical practice and always put the patient first.
