Who is Centura Health?

St. Catherine Hospital:

St. Catherine Hospital, located in Garden City, Kan., was founded by two pioneering physicians and the Dominican Sisters. They created and maintained the spirit that has enabled St. Catherine Hospital associates to develop a thriving health care facility unlike any other in southwest Kansas. Like many of the families and businesses in our community, our roots run deep – 85 years of excellence and counting. Residents of Garden City enjoy life in a relaxed, small-town (population approx. 30,000) with a zoo, several parks, golf courses, modern shopping and more.

Adult Psychiatric Overview:

The Adult Psychiatric department at St. Catherine Hospital is a ten-bed unit with an average admission rate of six to eight per month. We specialize in an acute inpatient psychiatric stabilization (between three to seven days) medication management, group sessions, precaution levels of observation, provide comprehensive treatment for major depression, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, personality disorder, significant adjustment to personal life crises, etc. Our patients are adults from the ED, medical floors, and community mental health services. What we do is so important because one in five people suffer some form of a mental illness in their lifetime. Even untreated stress levels can become an acute crisis and can interfere with a person's daily routine. In most severe cases, this can trigger hopelessness and danger to self or others. Untreated mental health and substance use disorders are the leading cause of disability worldwide. Stigma and discrimination often discourage people from getting the appropriate and needed treatment to live happier, healthier lives. These mental health conditions are not different from a physical health condition and they are equally treatable. They also require medical interventions of caring professionals seeking to advance their skills and obtain a well-rounded patient care experience. Your empathetic care can give a patient the light of hope and that is an equally rewarding feeling you also get when you know you have been part of



a successful medical healing experience. We are looking for team members that demonstrate tolerance, kindness, listening skills and patience in a fast-medical care pace.

Cardiac Cath Lab:

The Cardiac Cath Lab at St. Catherine Hospital is a lab that specializes in pacemakers, ICD's, IR procedures, and PICC lines. We provide adult care only, and the unit consists of three recovery bays with around seven-and-a-half procedures per week on average. We're here to bring cardiac care to the patients of western Kansas and eastern Colorado.

Emergency Department:

The Emergency Department at St. Catherine Hospital has eight beds with a possible run over for eight more beds, we treat all ED patients. We also do outpatient care in the afternoons as needed. Here, we see traumas, chest pain, strokes, sepsis and all other medical patients. Our mission is to treat others how you would like to be treated. This is a desirable department since we have a set schedule, are rural and tend to get some very interesting cases. We have a behavioral health inpatient unit and take care of a lot of behavioral health patients. In our department, we look for dependable team players.

Inpatient Rehabilitation:

The Inpatient Rehabilitation department at St. Catherine Hospital is a ten-bed, acute inpatient physical rehabilitation unit. We care for post stroke and extremely debilitated patients and rehabilitate them to be able to go home safely. Our mission is to rehabilitate patients to their best quality of life. We are a desirable team that works collaboratively together, somewhat flexible schedule, and have a good education program within rehab. We look for candidates that are willing to work as a team, can communicate well with staff, patients, and families and are supportive of the rehabilitation.

Intensive Care Unit (ICU):

The Intensive Care Unit (ICU) at St. Catherine Hospital is an eight-bed ICU. We staff an intensivist 24 hours per day, we care for a wide range of patients from sepsis, COPD exacerbation, respiratory distress, pneumonia, heart failure, GI bleed, renal failure and overdose. We take care of patients with art lines, central lines, intubations, procedures and telemetry monitoring for floor patients as well. We occasionally receive over flow from the med/surg floor if they are full. We are on a mission to provide the best care for all patients, from pediatrics to geriatrics and all those in between. Individuals might want to join our department because we are known for our collaborative teamwork. We are more of a family than co-workers. The associates support one another and never leave anyone behind. We can self-schedule and have a chance to develop a multitude of skills. There is



a variety of personalities on our unit because that allows us to provide the best care to each patient individually.

Medical Unit:

The Medical Unit at St. Catherine Hospital specializes in general medical and surgical patient care and is a 48-bed unit. We treat adult patients that are 16 years and older needing medical or surgical intervention with no overflow from other departments. We are a desirable department because we value teamwork and collaboration. Patient safety and experience is a priority as well as associate job satisfaction. We look for energetic, reliable and hard-working candidates to join our team.

Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU):

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at St. Catherine Hospital is a Level II NICU with seven available beds. We care for babies born at 32 weeks and above. If we have a baby born at our hospital earlier than 32 weeks, we stabilize the baby and then transfer to a higher level of care NICU. We care for a wide range of medical diagnoses in the NICU including but not limited to: pneumonia, sepsis, pneumothorax, hypoglycemia, prematurity and feeders and growers. We take care of babies on ventilators, nasal cannulas, chest tubes, umbilical lines, needle aspirations, antibiotics, etc. We have four dedicated pediatricians that care for our babies in the NICU who also consult with neonatologists as needed. We receive transfers into our NICU from our surrounding towns for babies that need a NICU or higher level of care. One of the unique things about working in a rural hospital is that you get to see a wide range of different things that you may not get to see in a bigger hospital where you specialize in one area. Our NICU team is cross-trained to OB postpartum and pediatrics so you gain a variety of skills in several different areas. We always look for someone who is a team player and is passionate about being a baby's advocate. As a NICU nurse you develop relationships with the baby's family and want to provide the best care. Impacting someone's life in a positive way so drastically connects us to our patients and helps us remember we make a difference every day. Our mission is to provide high-quality compassionate care to the patient and their family to get them healthy and home as soon as we can.

OB Post Partum:

The OB Post-Partum department at St. Catherine Hospital consists of 12 LDRP, one triage, one OR suite, four pediatric rooms and seven open bay NICU Level II rooms. This consists of three different units: L&D, pediatrics and NICU. We treat pregnant women, pediatric patients from two to 17 days, 32 weeks gestational to 40 weeks for NICU. This department is desirable as it is a rural, main hub, where caregivers get to see and do almost anything. We are very hands-on when taking care of patients. Candidates are



welcome who are flexible and passionate about patient care. Candidates must be willing to help in other departments depending on our census. Our department is great for growing your skill and helping you on your career journey.

Surgery:

The surgery department at St. Catherine Hospital has a main OR with four suites, Urology suite and GI suite. Our average monthly volume is approximately 450-500 patients. We specialize in general surgery, orthopedics, GYN, OB c-sections, urology, plastics and podiatry. We service all age groups except neonates to two years. Our team offers an encouraging environment for individuals to learn, grow and become part of the surgical services family where the team has a willingness to teach new nurses. Candidates must be willing to learn and be flexible.
